Top Art Shows in New York This Week: Miriam Schapiro to Paolo Veronese

New exhibitions and art shows open in New York this week, ranging from a selection of sculptures at Luhring Augustine to [Miriam Schapiro](#)'s work in dialogue with artworks of nine contemporary artists at the Museum of Arts and Design. This week also sees the last days of the exhibition of two important Renaissance paintings by the artist [Paolo Veronese](#) that have not left Italy for more than 450 years at the Frick Collection. NEW AND RECENT OPENINGS

Gavin Kenyon's "Pathological Chroma" at Marlborough Contemporary

March 22 through April 28, 2018

Gavin Kenyon, known for his anthropomorphic explorations in cast concrete and ceramic, presents new pieces that look at his expanding vocabulary of materials, formal strategies, and surface treatments. For his solo exhibition at the gallery the artist includes a selection of sculpture and quilted paintings. Central to the display is a group of loosely figurative cast concrete works made by filling shoes, pieces of clothing, handbags and cast-off fabrics. Kenyon's paintings are created by using the painter's rejected canvasses. Cast iron is a common feature in several of his works that reflects Kenyon's pan-historical, all-in approach to sculptural production.
